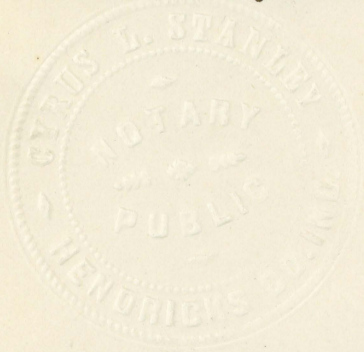
The Guardian John T. Thompson further represents to the Court that his ward Mary Arbutle is now dead that she died on the 7th day of February 1884 and that he the said Guardian

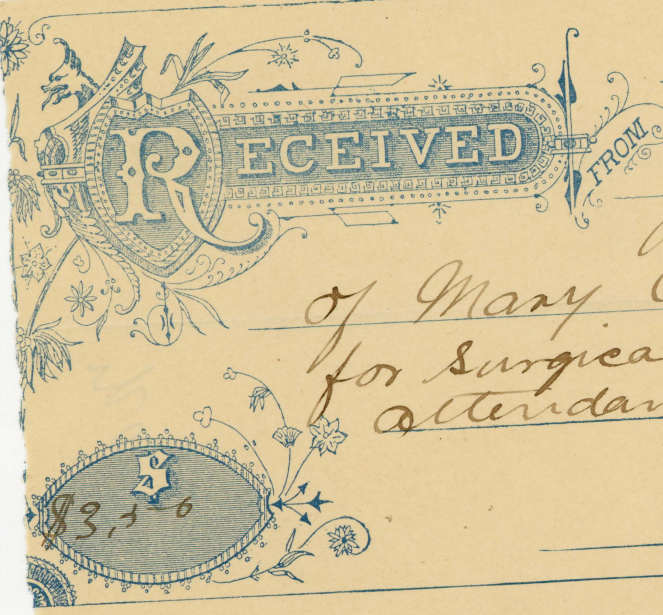

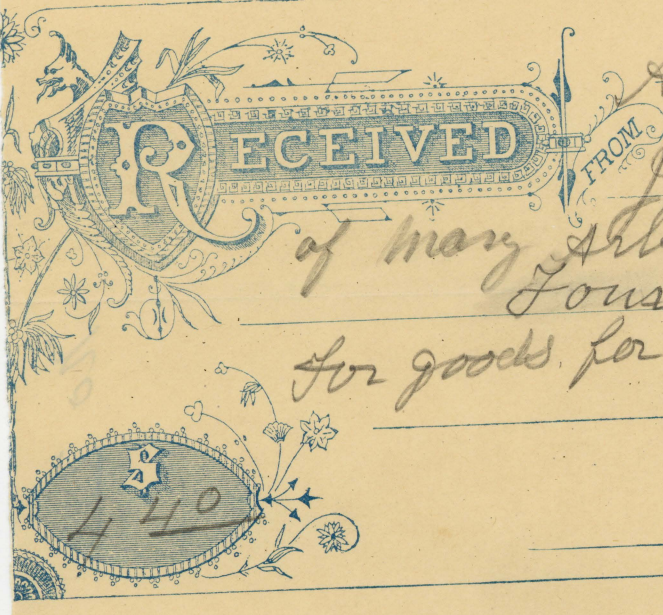
