Francis Carlew administratrix of the estate  
of Parson Carlew deceased respectfully reports, that  
in pursuance of an order of this Honorable Court, made  
at the last February Term thereof, she the said Francis  
having given due notice of the time and place of sale  
agreeably to the directions of said Order, did on the  
5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1838, expose to sale by public vendue,  
the land therein mentioned, and sold the same to  
Richard Pray for the sum of Six Hundred doll-  
ars, he being the highest bidder, and that being the  
highest and best price bid for the same.

The terms of sale as made known at the time  
of <sup>said</sup> sale, was one third of the purchase money  
to be paid in hand, one third September 1<sup>st</sup>  
1838 and the remaining one third on the 1<sup>st</sup> Septe-  
-ber 1839 But <sup>as it is</sup> may it please your Honor  
the land was struck off and sold as aforesaid  
the said Richard Pray neglected to pay the said  
one third of the purchase money as he was  
bound to do by the terms of sale aforesaid, and  
still does neglect so to do. Wherefore she prays  
for that, and other causes that said sale so made  
as aforesaid may be set aside, and that such  
other and further order as to the Court may seem  
right and Just, may be made




