Twelve Months after date we promised
to pay J. D. Parker, in order the sum of
Thirty four dollars. Thirt^y one and a half cents for
value rec^d of him. This note given for and in
consideration of the distributive share of Elizabeth
Leash, heir to the Estate of John Cash, dec^d and
when the said Elizabeth arrives at lawful
age she is to receipt for the above sum & then
this note is to be delivered up without the payment
thereof, as she has this day drawn said amount &
this note is only given to secure the said Parker
against the second payment of said sum.

To the Honorable Abram Bland judge of the
Superior Court, at the Aug Term 1850.

M^r J. Cash, one of the heirs at law of the
Estate of John Cash, and who administered the
same, would state to your Honor, that upon
final settlement of the Estate, and distribution
of the net proceeds thereof, among the several
heirs under the Order and proceedings of this Court,
the sum of \$34.31, appeared to be the full portion
and share of Elizabeth Cash, one of the heirs who
was then a minor, in her twentieth year, and that
sum was then paid into Court for and on her
account; And because of her being so near the
years of Majority, it was deemed best not to
require the appointment of a guardian to take
charge of so small a sum, but that the money
should remain in the hands of the Clerk of this
Court until she should arrive at the age of twenty
one years. But afterwards, the undersigned
being informed that the said Elizabeth was about
intermarrying with one Henry B. Crawford, and
believing that the use of that small sum of
money would be worth more to her then, than
at any other time, prevailed upon Joshua D.
Parker Clerk of said Court, to pay the said \$34.31^{1/2}
over to said Elizabeth on the 6th day of June 1849;
She then being ^{thirteen} ~~twenty~~ years Eleven months and
Nineteen days old; And to secure the said Parker in
the payment so made, the undersigned, together with
James Christie and Eli Rammell made & delivered
to said Parker their promissory note for the amount
thereof, with the understanding that when Elizabeth arrived
at the age of twenty one year, and should then receipt to
Parker for the money so received, the note aforesaid
should be cancelled. That after said Elizabeth rec^d
said money, to-wit, on the 13th day of December 1849 she
was married to said Henry B. Crawford, and lived
with him until the 22nd day of March 1850 when she died.

being then twenty years, nine months & twenty five days
old. And no receipt ever having been given by her
husband for the money aforesaid. Wherefore
the undersigned prays that an Order of this
Court be entered of record, directing the
said Joshua D. Parker with the payment of said
sum of money to the said Elizabeth, and that the
note aforesaid may be cancelled &c. And he
as in duty bound will ever pray &c.
