Know all men, that I, William Cox, of the county of Hendricks, and state of Indiana, being weak and infirm in body, but clear in my mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death, do make and establish this my last Will and Testament, in the following manner and form, hereby declaring void and of no effect all Wills heretofore made and executed by me.

First. - It is my will that all my just debts be paid by my executors hereinafter named, out of any money which may be on hand at the time of my decease, or which they may collect on notes or debts due to me, or from the sale of any of my property.

Second. - It is my will that all my wearing apparel be given to my brother Hiram Cox - and that all of my deceased wife's wearing apparel, and one bed and bed clothing for it, be given to Hannah Johnson, wife of Jonathan Johnson, and the sister of my wife.

Thirdly. - It is my will that all my landed property, and all my personal property, of every description, not otherwise disposed of in this my will, be sold by my executors, and that the amount thereof, together with all my money, notes, and dues of every description, not otherwise disposed of, as aforesaid, be equally divided among my brother and sisters as follows:

To my brother Thomas Cox, of Randolph county, North Carolina, one portion.

To my brother Abel Cox, of the same place, one portion.

To my brother Hiram Cox, of Hendricks county Indiana, one portion.

To my brother Benjamin Cox, of the same state, one portion.

To my sister Mary Moffitt, wife of William Moffitt of Randolph county, North Carolina, one portion.

To my sister Martha Allen, widow of Nathan Allen deceased, of the same place, one portion.

To my sister Amy Stout, wife of Levi Stout, of

Randolph county Indiana, one portion.

To my wife, Ruth Stuby, wife of William Stuby,
of Hancock county, Indiana, one portion.

Lastly - It is my will that my brother Herman Cox
and John Stuby be my executors of this my last will
and testament, whom I hereby constitute and appoint
for that purpose.

month, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and thirty eight
