seals this 8th day of March 1831

The condition of the above Obligation is
such that whereas the above bounden
William Faught has obtained from the
Honorable Probate Court, letters of ad-
ministration on the Estate of Leonard
Faught decd, now should the said Will-
iam Faught well and truly discharge
the duties of administrator aforesaid
and pay over all monies which may
come into his hands as such admini-
strator to the persons authorized by
law to demand and receive the same
and do such other acts and things as
the law requires, then and in that case
the above Obligation to be void and
of none effect otherwise to remain
in full force and virtue in law and
equity
