I John Jessup of Henderson County and State of
Indiana being of sound mind and memory
~~and~~ calling to mind my mortality do make
the following will (Viz)

I give & bequeath to my sister Cash Cook
of Turry County, No Carolina five dollars to be
paid out of the money due and owing to me
from her husband John Cook

2nd I bequeath to my sister Anna Chandler
one cow, and five dollars in cash

3rdly I bequeath to my sister Polly Cook
part five dollars in cash.

4th I give and bequeath to my sister Sarah
Spitz my home.

5^{thly} I bequeath to Joseph Chandler the
debt which I hold on John Cook except the
five dollars before mentioned given to Cash
Cook.

6th I give to my brother John Jessup
the money which he owes me, about this
ty dollars

7th I give to my Brother Levi Jepsen my
rifle gun.

8th I give and bequeath to my dear
mother all the residue of my estate both
real and personal including the cash
on hand

Lastly I appoint my Brother John Jepsen

utors, requesting them, to pay my funeral
charges and all my just debts
