held and firmly bound unto the State of Indiana, in the penal sum of *five hundred* Dollars, Lawful Money of the United States, for the payment of which, well and truly to be made and done, we bind Ourselves, Our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents: Sealed with Our Seals, and dated this *5<sup>th</sup>* day of *October* 18*43*.

THE CONDITION of the above obligation is such, that if the above bound *William M. Rodgers* and *David Down*

will truly and faithfully perform the duties and trusts committed to *them* as *Executors*

of the Estate of *John Miles, Senr.* deceased, according to Law, and will truly and promptly deliver over to *their* successor to be appointed by the Probate Court of said County, should any such successor ever be appointed, all such estate, Goods, Chattels and assets, and assign to such successor all such RIGHTS AND CREDITS AS SHALL, OF RIGHT, belong to such successor upon reasonable demand made thereof, then the above obligation is to be void and of none effect, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue in Law.
