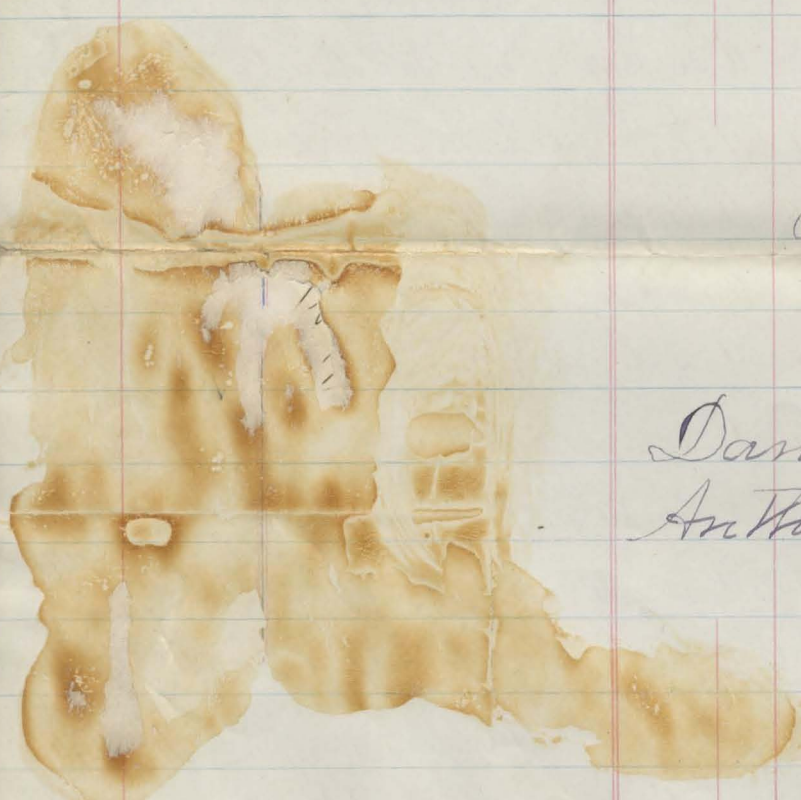

James Sharp having deceased Jan. 16th 1872, Intestate, I received letters of Administration February 3rd 1872. Made an Inventory of Personal Property February 7th 1872; and sold the same at public sale March 1st 1872. Had my portion of Real Estate as widow of the Deceased set of in the April Term of the Circuit Court. and owing to the insufficiency of the Personal Property to pay the debts, I asked and obtained an order to sell Real Estate, in the June Term of the Court of Common Pleas. and in pursuance of said ~~Ord~~ order, I sold Eighty Acres of Real Estate on the 22nd day of March 1873 at private sale, as per Report of same. which was sufficient to enable me to satisfy the debts of the deceased. without the further sale of Real Estate.

I found the business of the deceased with reference to a certain Estate of one Joseph Sharp, his brother, of Morgan County Indiana, of which Estate he was Administrator, in an unfinished condition; and in a way to cost, in an indirect way, far more than the usual ~~amount~~^{sum} amount of such liabilities; as follows: viz.

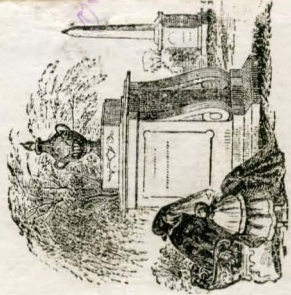


