Lawful Money of the United States for the payment
of which well and truly to be made and done
we bind our selves our heirs Executors and
Administrators, Jointly, severally, & firmly, by
these presents sealed with our seals and dated
this fourth day December - A. D. 1815

The Condition of the above obligation is such
that whereas the above bound Abner -
= Blair ... has this day obtained letters of
administration to administrator upon the
Estate of Ruth White late of
Hendricks County deceased, now if the
Said Abner Blair - shall diligently and
faithfully execute the duties and trusts
committed to and required of him as such
administrator and will obey all orders and
decrees of the Probate Court made pursuant
to law touching the administration of the
estate aforesaid, then and in that case the above
obligation is to be null and void otherwise
to be and remain in full force and virtue
in law. And we hereby authorize the Legislature
of the State of Indiana, to repeal alter or modify
~~any~~ any and all laws now in force without
in any way or manner releasing us or either of
us from the obligation of the above Bond.
