I William Wilson of Hendricks County in the State of Indiana do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time heretofore made; First I direct that my body be decently interred and that my funeral be conducted according to my situation in life and as to such worldly estates as it has pleased god to entrust me with I dispose of the same in the following manner to wit I direct first that all my just debts and funeral expences be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of the first money that shall come to hands of my executors from any portion of my estate real or personal I also direct that a fair valuation of appraisement be made by three judicious neighbors of all my estate including my household furniture and after being signed with their names that a copy be given to each of my executors; I also direct that all my stock in trade be sold at publick auction for Cash and that all the real estate of which I shall die seized or possessed shall be sold by my executors for its reasonable value for Cash or ^{on} such Credit and the amount thereof secured in such manner as is usual in like Cases to insure the full and punctual payment thereof; And to effectuall this my intention I hereby vest my Executors with full power and authority to dispose of my real estate in fee simple or for a term ^{of} years or other wise in as full a manner in every respect as I could do if living; I also direct that the whole of my household furniture be sold together with my real estate and the money thereof Equally divided by my executors equally between my severall daughters now living all equal shares and share alike
